VGR initiates collaboration with REDI

Region Västra Götalandsregionen (VGR) has begun discussions on indoor mobile network coverage with the think tank REDI, the Real Estate Digitalisation Initiative.

REDI is a network initiated by the Swedish Property Federation, Public Housing Sweden, and several of the country's largest property owners. According to a report produced by REDI, nearly 80 percent of all mobile usage takes place indoors, and almost 80 percent of all telephony is mobile. Data consumption is also expected to increase as more people use IoT (Internet of Things) and consume more streamed media.

Through REDI, Region Västra Götalandsregionen (VGR) and the property sector are collaborating on how to achieve reliable indoor coverage that meets the expectations of both organizations and visitors for a modern mobile network.

According to REDI, the ability to communicate indoors in the same way as outdoors should now be considered a given. REDI has therefore presented proposals on how to achieve the capabilities that end users both require and expect.

Together with several other Swedish regions, the Swedish Association of Local Authorities and Regions (SALAR), the Swedish Property Federation, and the property owners within REDI, Region Västra Götalandsregionen (VGR) intends to engage in dialogue with the major Swedish operators and network owners. The aim is to find a sustainable path forward and ensure a modern, future-proof solution for indoor connectivity in 5G networks.
